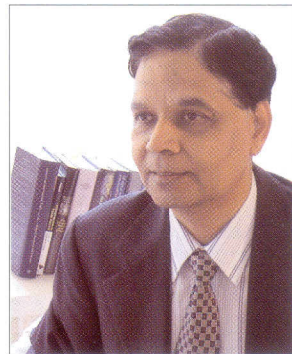

Prof Arvind Panagariya



Arvind Panagariya is a Professor of Economics & Jagdish Bhagwati Professor of Indian Political Economy at Columbia University and a Non-resident Senior Fellow at the Brookings Institution. He has been an ex-Chief Economist of the Asian Development Bank and a Professor of Economics and Co-director, Center for International Economics, University of Maryland at College Park. He has also worked for the World Bank, IMF, WTO, and UNCTAD in various capacities. He holds a Ph.D. degree in Economics from Princeton University.

Prof Panagariya has written and edited ten books. His book, *India: The Emerging Giant*, was published in March 2008 by the Oxford University Press, New York and has been described as the 'definitive book on the Indian economy' by Fareed Zakaria and 'a tour de horizon and a tour de force' by Jagdish Bhagwati. His previous books include *The Economics of Preferential Trade Agreements*, 1996, AEI Press (with Jagdish Bhagwati) and *Lectures on International Trade*, 1998, MIT Press (with J Bhagwati and T N Srinivasan).

He is currently an editor of the *India Policy Forum*, a journal modeled on the *Brookings Papers on Economic Activity* and jointly published by the Brookings Institution, Washington DC and the National Council on Applied Economic Research, New Delhi. His technical papers have appeared in various reputed journals. Prof Panagariya writes a monthly column in *The Economic Times*, India's top financial daily. He has also written guest columns in the *Financial Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, *The Hindu*, *India Today* and *Outlook*.
